WINTER WEATHER - SNOW, SALT BINS AND GRITTING

Vigo was the recipient of a very heavy snow fall in December, which affected the village for a week or more. The Parish Council has had some complaints about the lack of gritting on the roads. Gritting the roads is the responsibility of Kent County Council (Highways) and any issues should be reported to them directly. Here you can report various Winter Maintenance Issues (Ice / Snow problems or issues with Salt Bins). Scroll down to Winter Maintenance on the drop-down menu.

The Parish Council have contacted Kent Highways and reported that all the salt bins need refilling. There are eight salt bins in the village at present, but Vigo Parish Council will be discussing the provision of more salt bins at the next Full Parish Council meeting.

RED ROUTE BUSES - PROPOSED CHANGES TO 306 / 308 BUS SERVICE

We have received communication from the Public Transport Office at Kent County Council. As you may know, from October 2021, Red Route have taken over the 306 / 308 service. The Red Route service currently costs KCC a considerable amount of money, and they feel it performs very poorly in terms of value for money. Fuel prices have also increased, and Red Route have indicated that they cannot resource all of their work at current levels due to lack of drivers.

KCC have investigated the use of the service, post pandemic, to see if there is a more cost-effective way of operating the routes. The 306/308 bus service is the most expensive service that KCC currently funds. Proposed timetable changes are scheduled to come into force from February 2023.

Proposed Service:

The current timetable has significant school movements and operates with three peak buses. It is proposed to reduce this to two vehicles in the future. None of the school journeys will become unserved, although students on the afternoon bus back from Meopham School to Vigo will have to catch another service home from the school which runs 30 minutes later than the present bus.

The Monday to Friday daytime service will continue to run every 90 minutes. However, the first bus from Borough Green will now be at 07.38 with the last bus back from Sevenoaks at 15.26.

It is proposed to withdraw the evening buses between Bluewater, Gravesend and Borough Green.

On Saturdays it is proposed to maintain a 90-minute service between Gravesend and Vigo using just one bus and driver instead of the current two vehicles. As a result, there would not be a Saturday service between Vigo, Borough Green and Sevenoaks, except for route 6 between Seal and Sevenoaks. This will leave the 222 route to Tonbridge as the only Saturday service in Borough Green.

Vigo Parish Council are very concerned to read about these proposed changes and are in communications with KCC regarding this.

We have reached out to our County Council Member (Bryan Sweetland) and our Borough Council Members (Ejaz Aslam and Denise Tiran) as well as our MP (Adam Holloway).

Vigo Parish Council will continue to do what they can to stop these changes, which we feel will be entirely detrimental to those who live in the village.

STREETLIGHTS IN VIGO

As you may have read on our website, and in past newsletters, Gravesham Borough Council gave notice that they intended to terminate the agreement to maintain the Vigo Streetlights as from 1st April 2022.

Gravesham Borough Council had a responsibility to hand over the lights in good order – but Vigo Parish Council were aware that a number of streetlights were not working, and as such we made sure that a survey was undertaken to ensure that all faults were noted and recorded prior to the 1st April 2022.

The maintenance of the lights is now complicated, as who is responsible to carry out the work is dependent on the condition of the light at 1st April 2022. Faults noted prior to 1st April come under the remit of GBC, faults that have occurred since then will be repaired by the contractor engaged by the Parish Council.

We are hopeful that a full handover will happen in the coming months.

The Parish Council have put a budget aside to start upgrading our old lighting stock to LED, which will be more energy efficient. However, the increase in energy costs over the recent months has meant that some of that budget may need to be diverted to cover our electricity bills in the future, once the handover has happened.

In the meantime, please contact the Clerk if you notice any faults on the streetlights in the village – we will then be able to work out if the fault is to be repaired by Gravesham BC or by the Parish Contractor.

We are very pleased with our contractor (Streetlights Limited) – they do regular inspections of the lights in the village, including "night scouts" and we have found that repairs are carried out in a swift and efficient manner.

CCTV COVERAGE OF VIGO PLAY PARK

We have had a new "Pan / Tilt / Zoom" CCTV camera installed which covers the playpark on the village green. The coverage is excellent – we are able to zoom in on recorded footage and see the smallest of details.

This camera is in addition to a static camera which also covers the play park area, and forms part of a group of 15 cameras which the Parish Council have in total (covering the play park, the ball park, the car park, the village hall, The Bay and the bus stop on Erskine Road).





NUISANCE QUAD BIKES

Quad bikes continue to be a nusiance in the village. When the Parish Council are aware of issues, these are reported to the police. This CCTV image shows a quad bike being used to collect children from Vigo School. The quad then drives across The Bay which can only be considered reckless as there are many pedestrians in the area at that time.

UNAUTHORISED DEVELOPMENT OF FOWLERS STONE WOOD, HARVEL ROAD

The Parish Council is dissapointed that the unauthorised development of Fowlers Stone Wood has yet to be resolved.

We have been told that Gravesham Borough Council are working with their legal team and Legal Counsel regarding the on-going breaches of the injunction, and the non-compliance with an Issued Enforcement Notice. Counsel has advised Gravesham Borough Council that they need to commission some specialist advice, and this has not been straightforward. Gravesham Borough Council are working to get the work commissioned as soon as possible.

The Parish Council continue to press Gravesham Borough Council on this matter.

DUMPING GARDEN WASTE IN THE WOODLAND OR ON PARISH LAND

There has been a number of incidents where garden waste (and general waste in some cases) have been dumped either on Parish Land or in the woodland areas. Clearing this up takes time and also takes resources away from other jobs that need doing. If you witness any dumping or are aware of who may be doing this – please contact the Clerk – all communications will be treated confidentially.

SEED SWAP / VIGO LIBRARY

Did you know we run a seed swap in Vigo? You can drop off any spare seeds you have (please clearly label them) and pick up any that you fancy from the box.

You can find the box in the library, in the village hall.

TREE SURGERY IN VIGO

The Autumn / Winter period is the time when our Contractors, Paul & Steph do the majority of tree surgery in the village.

We have a list of tree works which is made up of routine maintenance, work that we have identified, and work that has been identified as a result of residents contacting us.

If you have any concerns about trees, please contact the Clerk. An assessment will be made, and if work is required it will be programmed accordingly. All work is agreed by Full Council. Paul & Steph are not able to agree to any work unless it is under the direction of the Parish Council.

Under no circumstances should residents carry out work on Parish trees. Trees in Vigo are protected by Tree Preservation Orders.

VPC do have a woodland management policy which clearly states what our commitment to tree work is – this can be viewed on our website www.vigo-kent.org (click on "The Council" and then on "Procedures & Policies"). If you would like a hard copy of these documents, please contact the Clerk.



Emergency or not?

The criteria for calling 999 (urgent) or 101 (non urgent) is as follows:

Call 999 if a crime is in progress, or there is a threat / danger to life and or property

Call 999 if there are nusiance bikes on busy roads or areas of high footfall

Call 999 if there are youths climbing on the village hall roof or the school roof

Your call will be assessed by a call handler and the appropriate action taken

Call 101 for non- urgent matters

(including nuisance bikes on community land in general, or low foot-fall areas)

BAT WALKS



This has proved to be fortuitous, as sadly the original Coffee Project is no longer running as Action With Communities in Rural Kent (the charity which started the project) is closing in the very near future. Although we are saddened to hear of the closure of ACRK and the many Pop-Up Cafes that will close as a result – we are pleased to say that the Vigo Café continues to run and is very popular and well attended. We meet on the first Friday of the month, in the small hall, between 10.30 and 12.30. We have around 30 visitors each time, and a warm welcome is guaranteed.

Disabled access is available, please go to the slope at the side of the hall, where a doorbell will be available – someone will come and let you in. Free hot drinks, cakes, biscuits, and fruit are available, but there are donation pots on the table for people to make a contribution if they can.
